This Indenture, Made this first day of October A.D. 1885 between J. S. Davis and Elyda A. Davis his wife of Lawrence Douglas County, in the State of Kansas of the first part, and Mary Lamberton of Lawrence Douglas County, in the State of Kansas of the second part:

Witnesseth, That said parties of the first part, in consideration of the sum of One Thousand Dollars the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do by these presents, grant, bargain, sell and convey unto said party of the second part her heirs and assigns, all the following described real estate, situated in the County of Douglas and State of Kansas to wit:

Beginning on south side of Warren Street extended west from City of Lawrence $83\frac{1}{2}$ feet west of a point $32\frac{2}{3}$ feet west of Block 10 Leaven's second edition to City of Lawrence west along south side said Warren Street extended $74\frac{1}{2}$ feet, south $348\frac{1}{2}$ feet East $74\frac{1}{2}$ feet North $348\frac{1}{2}$ feet to place of beginning.

To have and to hold the same, together with all the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereto belonging, or in any wise appertaining, forever:

Provided always, and these presents are upon this express condition, that whereas, said J. S. Davis and Elyda A. Davis have this day executed and delivered one certain promissory note in writing, to said party of the second part, of which the following is a copy:

One year after date we promise to pay to Mary Lamberton or order One Thousand dollars at the National Bank of Lawrence with interest at 9%, payable semi-annually for value received.
