And this conveyance shall be void if such payment be made as is herein specified. But if default be made in such payment, or any part thereof or interest thereon, or if the taxes on said land are not paid when the same becomes due and payable, or if the insurance is not kept up thereon, as provided herein, then this conveyance shall become absolute, and the whole sum remaining unpaid shall immediately become due and payable, at the option of the holder thereof; and it shall be lawful for said party of the second part, his executors administrators and assigns, at any time thereafter, to sell the premises hereby granted to any part thereof, in the manner prescribed by law, "appraisement waived;" and out of all monies arising from such sale, to retain the amount then unpaid of principal and interest together with the costs and charges of making such sale, and the surplus, if any there be, shall be paid by the party making such sale, on demand, to the said party of the first part her heirs and assigns.
