 title and interest to all rights and claims in said mortgage mentioned and conveyed, Lawrence in the County of Douglas and State of Kansas

This Indenture, Made this First day of March
 in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hun-
 dred and eighty six between David Burr and Harriet
 E. Burr his wife of Lawrence in the County of Douglas
 and State of Kansas, of the first part, and Guy
 Bennett of the second part:

Witnesseth, That the saids part of the first
 part, in consideration of the sum of Six Hundred
 and thirty Dollars, to them duly paid, the recpts
 of which is hereby acknowledged, have sold and by these
 presents do grant bargain, sell and mortgage to the
 said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns
 forever, all that tract or parcel of land situated in
 the County of Douglas and State of Kansas, described
 as follows, to wit:

The North Half of Lot No Eleven (11)
 on Pinkney Street in the City of Lawrence in said
 County and State according to the plat of said
 City

with the appurtenances, and all the estate, title
 and interest of the said parties of the first part
 therein. And the said David Burr ^{does} hereby covenant
 and agree that at the delivery hereof he is the
 lawful owner of the premises above granted and
 seized of a good and indefeasible estate of inheritance
 therein, free and clear of all incumbrances and
 that he will warrant and defend the same against
 all claims whatsoever. This Grant is intended as a
 Mortgage to secure the payment of the sum of Six
 hundred and thirty Dollars, according to the terms of
 one certain promissory note this day executed by the
 said David Burr to the said party of the second part.
 Said note being given for the sum of Six hundred
 and thirty Dollars, dated March 1st 1886 due and payable
 in one year from date thereof with interest thereon
 from the date thereof, until paid according to the
 terms of said note and coupons thereto attached.

And this conveyance shall be void if such payment
 be made as in said note and coupons thereto
 attached, and as is hereinafter specified. And the
 said parties of the first part hereby agree to pay
 all taxes assessed on said premises before any
 penalties or costs shall accrue on account thereof,
