This Indenture, made this Seventeenth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty six, between William Caughlin and Wira his wife of Lawrence in the County of Douglas and State of Kansas, of the first part and Jacob W. Petty of the second part,

Witnesseth; That the said parties of the first part, in consideration of the sum of Three hundred and Fifty Dollars, to them duly paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, have sold and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and mortgage to the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns forever, all that tract or parcel of land situated in the County of Douglas and State of Kansas, described as follows, to-wit:

All of the North half of the North half of Lot number Six (6) in Section number sixteen (16) in Township Twelve (12) of Range Twenty (20) lying East of Right of way of the Union Pacific Railway Company crossing said lot, and containing approximately Five and $\frac{1}{8}$ acres to the same more or less, with all the appurtenances, and all the estate, title and interest of the said parties of the first part therein. And the said Parties of the First Part do hereby covenant and agree that at the delivery hereof they are the lawful owners of the premises above granted, and seized of a good and indefeasible estate of inheritance therein free and clear of all encumbrances

This grant is intended as a mortgage to secure the payment of the sum of Three hundred and fifty dollars according to the terms of two certain Promissory notes this day executed and delivered by the said Parties of the First part to the said party of the second part: for \$175⁰⁰ each.
