This Indenture, Made this sixth day of May 1886 by and between Wm Hurst and Rachel Hurst his wife of the County of Jackson and State of Missouri of the first part and H. Van Doren of the County of Jackson and State of Missouri of the second part:

Witnesseth, That said parties of the first part, in consideration of the sum of Two Hundred and 00/100 Dollars, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, and of the debt hereinafter mentioned, do by these presents Grant, Bargain, Sell and convey unto the said party of the Second Part, his heirs and assigns, all the following described Real Estate, situated in the County of Douglas and State of Kansas, to-wit:

The east forty eight (48) feet of the North 170 feet of the North West quarter of Block 50 in West Lawrence in the City of Lawrence, as follows: Beginning (350 feet) Three hundred and fifty feet east of the centre of California Street, where centre of Pinckney Street intersects the same. Thence South on centre line of block fifty (50) one hundred and seventy (170) feet. Thence West forty eight (48) feet Thence north one hundred and seventy feet (170) Thence East forty Eight (48) feet to place of beginning

To Have and to hold the same, together with all and singular the rights, privileges and tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging, or in anywise appertaining, forever, upon this express condition to-wit: That, Whereas, Wm Hurst and Rachel Hurst have this day executed and delivered their certain promissory note to said party of the second part, in words and figures as follows, viz:

For value received, one year after date, we promise to pay to the order of H. Van Doren Two Hundred Dollars, with interest at 10 per cent per annum from date.
