On January 15, 1949 Frederick J. Moreau and Jeanne, his wife, made a note in the sum of \$4600 promising to pay "to the order of William Frome and Mildred J. Frome, his wife, as joint tenants, with the right of survivorship and not as tenants in common * * *." This note was secured by a mortgage upon real estate in Lawrence, Kansas described as follows:

The South 50 feet of the West 131.2 feet of Lot No. Seven (7) and the North 10 feet of the West 131.2 feet of Lot No. Eight (8), all in Hlock No. Four (4) in South Lawrence, an Addition to the City of Lawrence.

This note was paid in full pursuant to the terms on December 26, 1955. The named mortgages is William Frome but the note which it secured was paid in full to Mr. Frome while he lived and to Mrs. Frome after his death.

Therefore, these presents are to make known that we, Mrs. Mildred J. Frome, Widow of Mr. Frome and Jeannette (Frome) McRee of Big Springe, Texas, Eleanor (Frome) Moore of Kansas City, Missouri, and Eugene William Frome, now of London, England, and Warren John Frome, Manassas, Virginia, and Roberta (Frome) Huhn of Decatur, Georgia as the only heirs of the late William Frome, who at the time of his death on or about March 21, 1952 was the owner of the above referred to mortgage, recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds in Douglas County, Kansas on the 20th day of January 19k9 in book 95 of mortgages at page 205, covering the real estate described above, do hereby release and discharge such property from the lien thereof.
