Witnesseth, that the said parties of the
first part, in consideration of the sum of Five Hun-
dred $\frac{1}{2}$ Dollars, to them duly paid, the receipt of
which is hereby acknowledged, have sold and by
these presents do grant, bargain, sell and mortgage
to the said party of the second part, her heirs and
assigns forever, all that tract or parcel of land
situated in the County of Douglas and State of Kansas
described as follows, to wit:

The West half of lot No. Thirteen (13) in Addition No.
Eleven (11) North Lawrence in the City of Lawrence.
with the appurtenances, and all the estate, title and
interest of the said parties of the first part therein.
And the said Olivia J. Chaplin does hereby covenant
and agree that at the delivery hereof she is the law-
ful owner of the premises above granted and seized
of a good and indefeasible estate of inheritance
therein, free, and clear of all incumbrances and that
she will warrant and defend the same against all
claims whatsoever. This Grant is intended as a
