This Indenture, Made this Twenty fourth day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty seven between George W. Duncan and Betty J. Duncan, husband and wife of Leavenworth Township in the County of Douglas and State of Kansas of the first part and Sarah E. Gilman of the second part:

Witnesseth, That the said parties of the first part, in consideration of the sum of Eleven Hundred Dollars to them duly paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, have sold and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and mortgage to the said party of the second part, her heirs and assigns forever, all that tract or parcel of land situated in the County of Douglas and State of Kansas, described as follows, to wit:

The East half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of the North West quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of Section number Nine ($\frac{1}{2}$) in Town number Nine ($\frac{1}{2}$) Range number Seventeen ($\frac{1}{2}$) also the South West quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of the North East quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of said Section Nine ($\frac{1}{2}$) Town Nine ($\frac{1}{2}$) Range seventeen ($\frac{1}{2}$), containing in all One hundred and Twenty (20) acres, with the appurtenances, and all the estate, title and interest of the said parties of the first part therein.
