

Big Springs Kansas May 10th 1888

1. Seven months after date we promise to pay to the Order of W. S. Pennington two hundred (\$200) dollars at eight per cent interest per annum without defalcation value received.
2. Big Springs Kansas May 10th 1880 twelve months after date we promise to pay to the order of W. S. Pennington Three Hundred (\$300) dollars at eight per cent interest per annum without defalcation value received.
3. Big Springs Kansas May 13th 1880 Two years after date we promise to pay to the order of W. S. Pennington Four Hundred and ninety six dollars and eighty two cents at eight per cent interest per annum without defalcation value received.
4. Big Springs Kansas May 12 1880 Three years after date we promise to pay to the order of W. S. Pennington Five Hundred dollars at eight per cent interest per annum without defalcation value received.

Now, if said parties of the first part shall pay on cause to be
paid to said party of the second part, his heirs or assigns, said sum
of money in the above described notes mentioned, together with
the interest thereon according to the terms and tenor of the
same, then these presents shall be wholly discharged and
void, and otherwise shall remain in full force and effect. But
if said sum or sums of money, or any part thereof, or any in-
terest thereon, is not paid, when the same is due, and if the
taxes and assessments of every nature which are or may be assess-
ed and levied against said premises or any part thereof are
not paid when the same are by law made due and payable, then
the whole of said sum and sums, and interest thereon, shall, and
by these presents become due and payable, and said party of
the second part shall be entitled to the possession of said prem-
ises.
