And the said party of the first part shall and will at his own expense, from his time until said notes and interest and all sums & charges by virtue hereof, are fully paid off and discharged, keep the buildings erected and to be erected on said land insured to the amount of Eight hundred & 50 Dollars to the satisfaction of the mortgagee or assigns in one responsible Insurance Company duly authorized to do business in this State, for the benefit of the party of the second part, and assigns who shall have possession of all the policies of insurance and all renewal receipts thereof. And the said party of the first part hereby waive all benefits of the stay, valuation or appraisement laws of the State of Kansas.
