

This Indenture Made this 14<sup>th</sup> day of November in the year of our Lord, one thousand and eight hundred and eighty-eight between George T. Clark, a single man, of Lawrence Kansas of the first part and W. C. Beardsley, of Auburn New York of the second part:

Witnesseth, that the said party of the first part for and in consideration of the sum of Nine Hundred Dollars, to him in hand paid by the said party of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby confessed and acknowledged, hath granted, bargained, sold and conveyed, and by these presents doth grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said party of the second part, and to his heirs and assigns forever, all the following described piece and parcel of land lying and situate in the City of Lawrence County of Douglas and State of Kansas, to-wit:

No. One hundred and sixty (160) on Ohio Street in the said City of Lawrence

To have and to hold the same, with all and singular the hereditaments and appurtenances thereto belonging, unto the party of the second part and to his heirs and assigns forever. And the said George T. Clark doth hereby covenant and agree, that at the delivery hereof he is the lawful owner of the premises above granted, and seized of a good and insurable estate of inheritance therein, free and clear of all incumbrances and that he will warrant and defend the same in the quiet and peaceful possession of said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns forever, against all persons lawfully claiming the same.

Provided always, and these presents are upon these express conditions, whereof, the said George T. Clark is justly indebted unto the said W. C. Beardsley, in the principal sum of Nine Hundred Dollars, lawful money of the United States of America being for a loan thereof on the day and date hereof, made by the said W. C. Beardsley, to the said George T. Clark and secured to be paid by the certain promissory note of the said George T. Clark bearing even date herewith, payable to the order of the said W. C. Beardsley, in three years from the date thereof, at his office in the City of Auburn, and State of New York, with interest after maturity, or default in payment of interest, at the rate of twelve per cent per annum, until the said principal sum fully paid. The interest on said note from date to maturity or default, is to be paid semi-annually, on the 14<sup>th</sup> day of May and of November in each and every year, and is specified by six (6) ten dollar notes or coupons of even date herewith, attached to the said note and payable at said office of W. C. Beardsley, in the City of Auburn, New York, and unpaid by said promissory note it is agreed that if default be made in the payment of any interest coupon at maturity, then the said principal sum of Nine
