This Indenture made this second day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty nine, between Joseph Griffis and Mary J. Griffis husband and wife being of lawful age of the County of Douglas, and State of Kansas, of the first part, and Edward Russell of Lawrence, Kansas of the second part.

Witnesseth, That the parties of the first part, in consideration of the sum of One hundred and fifty seven Dollars, to them in hand paid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have sold and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and convey to the said party of the second part heirs and assigns forever, the following tract or parcel of land situated in the County of Douglas and State of Kansas, described as follows: town: The South West Quarter of section sixteen in Burnship Township 14<sup>th</sup> of Range Twenty (20) with the appurtenances and all the estate, title and interest of the said parties of the first part therein above granted, and seized of a good and indefeasible estate of inheritance therein; that they have good right to sell and convey said premises subject however to a prior mortgage for \$1700.00 of this date made to Edward Russell.

This Grant is intended as a Mortgage to secure the payment of the sum of One hundred and sixty seven Dollars, according to the terms of a certain mortgage note this day executed by the said parties of the first part all dated January 2<sup>nd</sup> 1879, payable to Russell & Metcalf in the County of Douglas, at the National Bank in Lawrence Kansas with New York Exchange.

Now, if such payment be made as herein specified, this conveyance shall be void, and shall be released upon demand of the parties of the first part. But if default be made in the payment of said sum, or any part thereof, or any interest thereon, or in the taxes assessments, or if default be made in the payments upon the first mortgage or any agreement therein, then this conveyance shall become absolute, and the whole of said principal and interest
