Witnesseth, that the said parties of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of One Thousand Dollars, to them in hand paid by the said party of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby confessed and acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and conveyed and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said party of the second part, and to his heirs and assigns forever, all the following described piece and parcel of land lying and situated in the County of Douglas and State of Kansas.

Recommencing at a point four and $\frac{1}{2}$ chains south of the South East corner of the South East quarter of Section No. Eleven, in Township No. Twelve (12) South of Range No. Nineteen (19) East of Sixth Principal Meridian, thence West Forty (40) chains, thence North Sixty and $\frac{1}{2}$ chains, thence East Thirteen and $\frac{1}{2}$ chains, thence North Fifteen and $\frac{1}{2}$ chains, thence East Twenty six and $\frac{1}{2}$ chains, thence South Twenty two and $\frac{1}{2}$ chains to place of beginning containing fifty seven and $\frac{1}{2}$ acres of land, more or less, subject to a mortgage of One Thousand Dollars to W. C. Beardley, dated October 17, 1895 and recorded in Book 16 of Mortgages at page 44, to have and to hold the same, with all and singular the hereditaments and appurtenances thereto belonging, unto the party of the second part and to his heirs and assigns, forever. And the said Daniel J. Husted and Rachel Husted do hereby covenant and agree, that at the delivery hereof they are the lawful owners of the premises above granted and seized of a good and indefeasible estate of inheritance therein, free and clear of all incumbrances, and that they will warrant and defend the same in the quiet and peaceable possession of said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns, corner, against all persons lawfully claiming the same.

Provided Always, And these presents are upon this express condition that whereas, the said Daniel J. Husted and Rachel Husted are justly indebted unto the said W. C. Beardley in the principal sum of One Thousand Dollars, lawful money of the United States of America, being for a loan thereof on the day and date hereof, made by the said W. C. Beardley, to the said Daniel J. Husted and Rachel Husted and secured to be paid by the certain promissory note of the said Daniel J. Husted and Rachel Husted bearing even date herewith payable to the order of the said W. C. Beardley, in five (5) years from the date thereof, at his office in the City of Auburn, and State of New York, with interest after maturity, or default in payment of interest, at the rate of twelve per cent; per
