

cease to hold meetings as a board or exercise any control or management over the affairs of said Company or in any way, shape or manner to attempt to control or manage the affairs of said Company, and particularly to refrain from any further attempt to cancel, annul or destroy any and all of the mortgages in said petition described. And this is to still further to command you, C. Kohler President of said Company and J. T. Philbrick Secretary of said Company and you, A. Thomas, Henry Mosser, E. Pope, J. T. Philbrick, W. H. Smallwood, A. Bronnmeisick, John Walls, C. Kohler, Chas. Hatz, Del. Hatz, Adam Reigert, August Rubin, S. Satzky, Wabruny and Wm. Hill, Constituting the Board of Directors of said Company as in said Petition set forth, and each and every member thereof to wholly refrain from using the seal of said Company, in attesting any rule by law, order or proceeding hereafter to be had or held by any or all of you as said Board of Directors, or in any wise to hold or attempt to hold and transact any business of said Company until the further orders of the District Court in session or the Judge thereof at Chambers.

And it is further ordered that before said injunction or order therefor issues that Plaintiffs do give a Bond to Defts in the sum of \$5000 as provided by law. And it is further ordered that One Burns Eg of the City of Topeka, Kan. and he is hereby appointed Receiver of all the goods, chattles, rights in action and property both personal and real of every nature description and kind with full power and authority to act in the premises as provided by law. And the said defendant is hereby commanded to deliver over to said Receiver all the Property both personal and real, all the Books, Papers, moneys, credits, rights in action, together with the Corporate Seal of said Company placing said Receiver in full possession thereof.

It is further that said Receiver do give a Bond to Defendants in the sum of One Thousand Dollars for the faithful performance of his duties as said Receiver.
