Byrley & Mary Byrley have this day, executed and delivered & certain promise or notes in writing to said parties of the second part, of which the following are copies: one dated & ob. on June 29, 1859, or on or before the 1st day of Oct 1859 for value received, we or either of us of the Post office County of Douglas State of Kansas promise to pay to the Aultman & Taylor Company, or order One hundred & Seventy Four Dollars One note described same as above due January 1st 1870 One note described same as above due Oct 1st 1870 One note described same as above due January 1st 1871 One note described same as above due Oct 1st 1871 One note described same as above except it calls for One hundred & Seventy Five Dollars and is due January 1st 1871.

Now, if said parties of the first part shall pay or cause to be paid, to said parties of the second part, their heirs or assigns, said sum of money, in the above described notes mentioned, together with the interest thereon according, to the terms and tenor of the same, then these presents shall be wholly discharged and void, and otherwise shall remain in full force and effect. But if said sum or sums of money, or any part thereof, or any interest thereon, is not paid, when the same is due, and if the taxes and assessments of every nature which are or may be assessed and levied against said premises or any part thereof are not paid when the same are by law made due and payable, then the whole of said sum and sums, and interest thereon, shall, and by these presents become due and payable, and said parties of the second part shall be entitled to the possession of said premises.
