This Indenture Made this Fifteenth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety between Samuel J. Churchill and Lou Churchill his wife of Lawrence in the County of Douglas and State of Kansas of the first part, and Frank H. Blaney of the second part:

Witnesseth, That the said parties of the first part, in consideration of the sum of Five Hundred Dollars, to them duly paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, have sold and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and mortgage to the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns forever, all that tract or parcel of land situated in the County of Douglas and State of Kansas, described as follows, to wit: Lots No One hundred and Twenty (120) One hundred and two (122) and One hundred and Twenty four (124) Block Three (3) North Lawrence Kans. Elm Street with the appurtenances, and all the estate, title and interest of the said parties of the first part therein. And the said Samuel J. Churchill and Lou Churchill do hereby covenant and agree that at the delivery hereof they the lawful owners of the premises above granted and seized of a good and indefeasible estate of inheritance therein, free and clear of all incumbrances, and that they will warrant and defend the same against all claims whatsoever. This Grant is intended as a Mortgage to secure the payment of the sum of Five Hundred Dollars, according to the terms of One certain promissory note this day executed
