Witnesseth, That the said parties of the first part, in consideration of the sum
of One Thousand Dollars, to them duly paid, the receipt of which is hereby
acknowledged, have sold and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and
mortgage to the said party of the second part, his heirs and assigns forever,
all that tract or parcel of land situated in the County of Douglas and
