This Indenture. Made this Fifteenth day of July in the year of our Lord One thousand
and Eight Hundred and Ninety Two, and between James W. Leale and Emma Sedley
his wife of Douglas County, State of Kansas first party, and the New England Loan and
Trust Company, second party.

Witnesseth. That said first party, in consideration of Sixteen Hundred Dollars,
the receipt of which by said first party is hereby acknowledged, does by these pre-
sents Grant, Bargain, Sell and Convey unto the said New England Loan and Trust
Company, its successors and assigns, forever, the following described real estate,
situated in Douglas County, State of Kansas, to wit: The South half of the Northwest
quarter and the North Forty (40) acres of the Southwest quarter of Section Seven (7) and
Lot Fifteen (15) in the vacated town of Black Jack in the South half of the Northeast
