

and appointed by the said party of the first part, who shall have the like powers and be subject to the same conditions as hereinbefore provided; and if such majority shall not make such nomination and appointment within said ninety days, then the Trustee so nominated and appointed by the party of the first part shall continue to act as, and shall thereafter be, the Trustee herein.

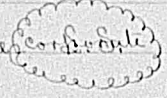
When the Trustee is finally selected, the appointment attested and certified in writing by the President and Secretary of the said party of the first part, under its corporate seal, and written acceptance thereof by the person or corporation appointed, or a copy thereof, to be recorded.

Thirteenth: The party of the first part covenants and agrees to cause this mortgage or deed of trust to be recorded as a mortgage of real and personal estate and kept filed as a mortgage of personal property, as may be required by the laws of the State of New York, in which the said estate is situated, so as to preserve and protect the lien thereof.
