This Indenture, Made this first day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety three between Eugene M. Freeman and Minnie E. Freeman his wife of Clinton township in the County of Douglas and State of Kansas, of the first part, and Hattie D. Hulme of the second part.

Witnesseth, that the said parties of the first part, in consideration of the sum of Sixteen hundred and no Dollars, to them duly paid the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, have sold and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and mortgage to the said party of the second part, her heirs and assigns forever, all that tract or parcel of land situated in the County of Douglas and State of Kansas, described as follows, to-wit: The North East quarter of Section thirteen (13) Township thirteen (13) Range Seventeen (17) with the appurtenances, and all the estate, title and interest of the said parties of the first part therein.
