

Three hundred dollars on or before five years after date with interest thereon at the rate of six per cent per annum payable annually according to the terms of one certain promissory note this day executed and delivered by the said party of the first part to the said party of the second part; and this conveyance shall be void if such payment be made as herein specified. But if default be made in said payment, or any part thereof, as provided, then it shall be lawful for the said party of the second part, his executors, administrators and assigns, at any time thereafter to sell the premises hereby granted, or any part thereof, in the manner prescribed by law, and out of all the moneys arising from such sale, to retain the amount then due for the principal and interest, together with the costs and charges of making such sale, and a reasonable attorney's fee for foreclosure, and the overplus, if any there be, shall be paid by the party making such sale, on demand, to the said party of the second part her heirs and assigns. Appraisement waived or not, at the option of the party of the second part.
