Witnesseth, That said party of the first part, in consideration of the sum of Eighty (80) Dollars, to him in hand paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, does by these presents, Grant, Bargain, Sell and Convey unto the said party of the second part, their heirs or assigns, the Real Estate situated in the County of Douglas and State of Kansas, particularly bounded and described as follows, to wit: The West One Hundred Ten (110) Acres of the South West quarter of Section Three (3) Township Fifteen (15) Range Nineteen (19)

To Have and to Hold the Same Forever; Provided, However, that whereas the said party of the first part has this day, for value received, executed and delivered to the said Bartlett Brothers, Ten Negotiable Promissory Notes, each for the sum of (\$8⁰⁰.) Eight Dollars, due respectively in 6, 12, 18, 24, 30, 36, 42, 48, 54 and 60 months after date, with interest from maturity at the rate of Ten per cent. per annum, each payable in their order at their office, in St Joseph, Missouri. When all of said notes shall have been fully paid, then this mortgage shall be canceled by any one of said Bartletts, at the cost of the said party of the first part.
