This Indenture, Made this eleventh day of April in the year of our

Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety four
Charles O. Roy and Julia A. Roy husband and wife
of Lafayette O. in the County of Douglas and State of Kansas
of the first part, and Nathan J. Roy, Sabitha E. Badsky and Martha J. Dodder
of the second part,

Witnesseth, That the said parties of the first part in consideration of the sum of
Two hundred and twenty six and $\frac{55}{100}$ DOLLARS, to them duly paid, the receipt
of which is hereby acknowledged, have sold and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and mortgage to the said parties
of the second part their heirs and assigns forever, all that tract or parcel of land situated in the County of Douglas and State
of Kansas, described as follows, to-wit: An undivided one sixth (1/6) in the East one half (1/2) of
the north west quarter (1/4) and the north west quarter (1/4) of the north west
quarter (1/4) of Section five (5) in Township fifteen (15) of Range eighteen (18) the
same being the interest as heirs and legatees of said parties of the first part in
the estates of Theophilus Roy and Lydia A. Roy both deceased, together with

with all the appurtenances, and all the estate, title and interest of the said parties of the first part therem. And the said
Charles O. Roy and Julia A. Roy parties of the first part
do hereby covenant and agree that at the delivery hereof they are the lawful owners of the premises above granted, and seized
of a good and indefeasible estate of inheritance therein free and clear of all incumbrances. In case said property
should be sold and not bring enough to pay the full amount of said notes, the
amount realized on such sale to be divided pro rata among the said payees of said
notes, none to be preferred over the other.

This grant is intended as a Mortgage to secure the payment of the sum of
Two hundred and twenty six and $\frac{55}{100}$ Dollars (\$226.55)
according to the terms of three certain promissory notes this day executed and delivered by the
said parties of the first part to the said parties of the second part:
to wit, one for \$106.50 to Marta J. Dodder one for \$77.50 to Sabitha E. Badsky and one for \$77.50 to
Nathan J. Roy all payable one day after date and it is hereby agreed that all of said
notes shall be pro-rated evenly out of proceeds of said property
and this conveyance shall be void if such payments be made as herein specified. But if default be made in such payment, or any
part thereof, or interest thereon, or the taxes, or if the insurance is not kept up thereon, then this conveyance shall become absolute,
and the whole amount shall become due and payable, and it shall be lawful for the said parties of the second part their
executors, administrators and assigns, at any time thereafter, to sell the premises hereby granted, or any part thereof, in the manner
prescribed by law, appraisement hereby waived or not at the option of the party of the second part executors, administrators
and assigns; and out of all the moneys arising from such sales, to retain the amount then due for principal and interest, together with
the costs and charges of making such sales, and the overplus, if any there be, shall be paid by the party making such sale on
demand to the said parties of the first part, their
heirs and assigns.
