

This Indenture, Made the Eighteenth day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand
and eight hundred and ninety four between William Hughes and Ellen J. Hughes his
wife, of the County of Douglas and State of Kansas parties of the first part, and The
Northwestern Mutual Life Insurance Company, party of the second part.

Witnesseth, That the said parties of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of Six Thousand (6000) dollars, to them in hand paid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained and sold, and by these presents do grant, bargain and sell unto the said party of the second part, and to its successors and assigns forever, the following Real Estate, lying and being in the County of Douglas, and State of Kansas, and known and described as follows, viz.: All of the southwest fractional quarter of Section number twenty six (26) Township number twelve (12) south of Range number twenty (20) east of the Sixth Principal Meridian lying east of the west line of the Shawnee Indian Reservation, containing one hundred and fourteen and nine one hundredths ($114\frac{9}{100}$) acres.

Also the fractional northwest quarter of Section number two (2) Township number thirteen (13) south of Range number twenty (20) east of the Sixth Principal Meridian lying east of the west line of the Shawnee Indian Reservation containing one hundred and thirty nine and forty one one hundredths ($139\frac{41}{100}$) acres, excepting therefrom a piece of land described as follows, viz. Beginning at the northeast corner of the northwest quarter of the northwest quarter of said Section number two (2) running thence west ten (10) rods, thence south sixteen (16) rods, thence east ten (10) rods, thence north sixteen (16) rods to the place of beginning; excepting also therefrom a certain piece of land containing about two and twenty nine one hundredths ($2\frac{29}{100}$) acres conveyed by William Hughes and wife to The Kansas City, Topeka and Western Railroad Company for a right of way, and described in deed dated May 19th 1883, and recorded in Volume 33 page 769 Douglas County Records of Deeds.

Together with the privileges and appurtenances to the same belonging, and all of the rents, issues and profits which may arise or be had therfrom. To Have and to Hold the same to the said party of the second part, its successors and assigns, forever.

And the said William Hughes for himself, his heirs, executors, administrators and assigns, covenants and agrees with the said party of the second part, its successors and assigns, to keep the building or buildings now standing or which may hereafter be erected on the above described premises, insured against loss or damage by fire in some solvent incorporated insurance company or companies, to be approved by said party of the second part, its successors or assigns, so long as the moneys hereby secured shall be unpaid, to the amount of at least Fifteen Hundred (\$1500) dollars; and to assign and keep assigned to said party of the second part, its successors and assigns, the policy or policies of such insurance, and deposit the same with the said party of the second part, and to
