This Indenture Made this first day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety five between Addie Whitman and A. A. Whitman her husband of Lawrence in the County of Douglas and State of Kansas, of the first part, and J. T. Field of Philadelphia Pa. of the second part.

Witnesseth, That the said parties of the first part, in consideration of the sum of Four Hundred Dollars, to them duly paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, have sold and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and mortgage to the said party of the second part her heirs and assigns forever, all that tract or parcel of land situated in the County of Douglas and State of Kansas, described as follows, to-wit: Lots Nos Thirty one (31) Thirty two (32) Thirty three (33) and Thirty four (34) all in Addition No Ten (10) in that part of the City of Lawrence formerly known as North Lawrence, except the following: Commencing 17 feet North of the South West corner of said lot No 34, thence running East 6 feet, thence South 17 feet more or less to a point 3 feet east of said Southwest corner of Lot 34, thence west 3 feet, thence North to the place of beginning - with the appurtenances, and all the estate, title and interest of the said parties of the first part therein.
