acknowledged, have granted, bargained and sold, and by these presents  
do grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said party of the second part  
his heirs and assigns forever, all the following described real estate, ly-

number Eighty Six (86) on Connecticut Street in the City of Lawrence  
Douglas County Kansas.

To have and to Hold the same, together with all and singular, the ten-
