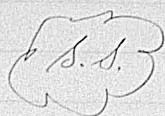
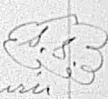

An Indenture made this 9th day of February, A.D. 1897,  
between The Southern Kansas Railway Company, a corporation  
organized and existing under the laws of the State of Kansas  
(hereinafter called the "Railway Company"), party of the  
first part, and Union Trust Company of New York, a  
corporation organized and existing under the laws  
of the State of New York, party of the second part.  
Whereas, on or about the first day of April 1887, the
