This Indenture, Made this 15 day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety nine between Samuel Burgaw and Ellen Burgaw, his wife of Lansing in the County of Douglas and State of Kansas of the first part, and Colin Timmerman of Long Beach, Calif. of the second part,

Witnesseth, That the said part of the first part in consideration of the sum of Eight hundred \$800 DOLLARS, to them duly paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, have sold and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and mortgage to the said part of the second part his heirs and assigns forever, all that tract or parcel of land situated in the County of Douglas and State of Kansas, described as follows, to-wit: The north east quarter (1/4) of the north west quarter (1/4) of section 16, Township 13 North, Range 10 West, containing 40 acres more or less.

with all the appurtenances, and all the estate, title and interest of the said part of the first part therein. And the said Samuel Burgaw and Ellen Burgaw do hereby covenant and agree that at the delivery hereof they are the lawful owner of the premises above granted, and seized of a good and indefeasible estate of inheritance therein free and clear of all incumbrances.

This grant is intended as a Mortgage to secure the payment of the sum of Eight hundred dollars according to the terms of one certain note this day executed and delivered by the said Samuel Burgaw and Ellen Burgaw to the said part of the second part: payable in five years with interest at the rate of six per cent per annum.

and this conveyance shall be void if such payments be made as herein specified. But if default be made in such payment, or any part thereof, or interest thereon, or the taxes, or if the insurance is not kept up thereon, then this conveyance shall become absolute, and the whole amount shall become due and payable, and it shall be lawful for the said part of the second part his executors, administrators and assigns, at any time thereafter, to sell the premises hereby granted, or any part thereof, in the manner prescribed by law, appraisement hereby waived or not at the option of the part of the second part executors, administrators or assigns; and out of all the moneys arising from such sales, to retain the amount then due for principal and interest, together with the costs and charges for making such sales, and the overplus, if any there be, shall be paid by the part making such sale on demand to the said Samuel Burgaw, his heirs and assigns.
