

This Indenture, Made this 22 day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety nine between Frank A. Curtis and his wife Lottie Curtis of Clinton in the County of Douglas and State of Kansas of the first part, and Elizabeth Curtis of the second part,

Witnesseth, That the said parties of the first part in consideration of the sum of Three hundred and forty six and 7/10 DOLLARS, to them duly paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, have sold and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and mortgage to the said party of the second part her heirs and assigns forever, all that tract or parcel of land situated in the County of Douglas and State of Kansas, described as follows, to-wit: The west one hundred acres of the south west quarter of section Twenty three in Township Thirteen of Range eighteen and 18 Begin nine hundred and thirty two feet east of the south west corner of the north west quarter of section Twenty three in Township Thirteen of Range eighteen. Thence running north 14 1/2 feet. Thence east 37 1/2 feet. Thence south 14 1/2 feet. Thence west 37 1/2 feet to the place of beginning. (See equivalent point 16 Rods north 1/4 section line and 133 1/2 feet east of point line of the north west quarter section 65 R. 18. Thence running north 14 1/2 feet to center of channel of Rock Creek. Thence along and up the center channel of said creek north 14 1/2 feet to south 1/4 section line 16 1/2 feet south and 1/2 foot east of 1/4 corner and 133 1/2 feet to the place of beginning. Small 137 1/2 acres. with all the appurtenances, and all the estate, title and interest of the said parties of the first part therein. And the said parties of the first part

do hereby covenant and agree that at the delivery hereof they are the lawful owner of the premises above granted, and seized of a good and indefeasible estate of inheritance therein free and clear of all incumbrances except as certain mortgages given to Samuel Upham for \$2000 dated Nov. 6, 1877 and recorded in Book 34 at page 364, Douglas County records. Upon which there has been paid \$350.

This grant is intended as a Mortgage to secure the payment of the sum of

Three hundred and forty six and 7/10 dollars according to the terms of several certain promissory notes this day executed and delivered by the said Frank A. Curtis to the said party of the second part her executors, administrators and assigns, at any time thereafter, to sell the premises hereby granted, or any part thereof, in the manner prescribed by law, appraisement hereby waived or not at the option of the party of the second part her executors, administrators or assigns; and out of all the moneys arising from such sales, to retain the amount then due for principal and interest, together with the cost and charges for making such sales, and the overplus, if any there be, shall be paid by the party of the first part Frank A. Curtis heirs and assigns.
