

This Indenture, Made this Twenty-fourth day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine, between Frank D. Cosley and Emma A. Cosley his wife of Lawrence, in the County of Douglas and State of Kansas, of the first part, and Mrs. Hannah E. Hopkins of Carmel N.Y. of the second part,

Witnesseth, That the said parties of the first part in consideration of the sum of

Six hundred DOLLARS, to them duly paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, have sold and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and mortgage to the said party of the second part her heirs and assigns forever, all that tract or parcel of land situated in the County of Douglas and State of Kansas, described as follows, to-wit The north half of lot number fifty-seven, Franklin Kentucky Street in the City of Lawrence Douglas County Kansas.

with all the appurtenances, and all the estate, title and interest of the said party of the first part therein. And the said parties of the first part do hereby covenant and agree that at the delivery hereof they the lawful owner(s) of the premises above granted, and seized of a good and indefeasible estate of inheritance therein free and clear of all incumbrances.

This grant is intended as a Mortgage to secure the payment of the sum of Six hundred Dollars

according to the terms of One certain Mortgage Note this day executed and delivered by the said Frank D. Cosley and Emma A. Cosley to the said party of the second part: Due on the 24th day of February 1905 with interest thereon from date to maturity or default as aforesaid by coupons attached to said note and interest after maturity shall accrue at the rate of six percent annual and fully paid. holder reserves the right to pay over by multiple installments or otherwise at any time before due date, after one year from date of this instrument and this conveyance shall be void if such payments be made as herein specified. But if default be made in such payment, or any part thereof, or interest thereon, or the taxes, or if the insurance is not kept up thereon, then this conveyance shall become absolute, and the whole amount shall become due and payable, and it shall be lawful for the said party of the second part her executors, administrators and assigns, at any time thereafter, to sell the premises hereby granted or any part thereof, in the manner prescribed by law, appraisement hereby waived or not at the option of the party of the second part her executors, administrators or assigns; and out of all the moneys arising from such sales, to retain the amount then due for principal and interest, together with the costs and charges for making such sales, and the overplus, if any there be, shall be paid by the party of the second part her making such sale on demand to the said parties of the first part their heirs and assigns.
