Whereas, on or about the eighteenth day of October A.D. 1874, William Hughes of the County of Douglas, and State of Kansas, executed and delivered to The Northwestern Mutual Life Insurance Company, a corporation of the State of Wisconsin, his bond bearing date on that day, conditioned for the payment to the said Insurance Company, or to its certain attorneys, successors, or assigns, of the sum of Six thousand (\$6000) dollars as follows, viz: Five hundred (\$500) dollars thereof at the expiration of Two (2) years, five hundred (\$500) Dollars thereof at the expiration of Three (3) years, and the remaining five thousand (\$5000) Dollars thereof at the expiration of five (5) years from the date of the said bond, with interest thereon, until paid, at the rate of six (6) per centum per annum, payable semi-annually on the first day of April and of October in each and every year; and at the same time the said William Hughes and Ellen J. Hughes, his wife, executed and delivered to the said Insurance Company a mortgage, bearing date with said bond, upon certain real estate lying and being in the County of Douglas, in the State of Kansas, and more particularly described in the said mortgage, as security for the payment of said bond, and which said mortgage was recorded in the Register of Deeds office of the said County of Douglas, in the State of Kansas, on the second day of November A.D. 1874, at nine o'clock A.M., and recorded in Volume 27 of Mortgages, on page 121; and whereas, payments to the amount of one thousand (\$1000) dollars were made to said Insurance Company in the principal of the said bond, as follows, to wit: Two hundred and fifty (\$250) dollars on January 20th 1877, Two hundred and fifty (\$250) Dollars on May 17th, 1877, and five hundred (\$500) dollars on December 16th 1877, and the interest has been paid to the first day of October 1877, and there remains unpaid on said bond, of the principal thereof, the just and full sum of five thousand (\$5000) dollars, with interest thereon from the first day of October 1877; and whereas, on or about the thirty first day of December 1877 the said William Hughes and wife executed and delivered to Wesley H. Dunsaw a mortgage covering the premises described in the aforesaid mortgage to the said Insurance Company; and whereas, the said William Hughes has requested the said Insurance Company to extend the time of payment of the said balance of five thousand (\$5000) dollars, remaining unpaid on the principal of said bond, until the eighteenth day of October 1904, with the privilege of paying one hundred (\$100) dollars or more of the said principal sum on any interest paying day after October 15th 1901 and before maturity, and the said Insurance Company has consented and agreed to make such extension as requested, and to reduce the rate of interest to
