Now, If said party of the first part shall pay or cause to be paid to said party of the second part, his heirs or assigns, said sum of money in the above described note mentioned, together with the interest thereon, according to the terms and tenor of the same, then these presents shall wholly discharged and void, and otherwise shall remain in full force and effect. But if said sum or some of money, or any part thereof, or any interest thereon, is not paid when the same is due, or if the taxes and assessments of every nature which are or may be assessed and levied against said premises, or any part thereof, are not paid when the same are by law made due and payable, then the whole of said sum and same, and interest thereon, shall, by these presents, become due and payable, and the party of the second part shall be entitled to the possession of said premises.
