This Indenture, Made this twelfth day of November in the
 year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty
 three between William J. Evans of the County of Douglas and
 State of Kansas of the first part and Thomas Pugh of said
 County and State of the second part:

Witnesseth, That the said party of the first part in consideration
 of the sum of twelve hundred and eighty five Dollars to
 him duly paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged
 has sold and by these presents does grant bargain, sell
 and mortgage to the said party of the second part his
 heirs and assigns forever all that tract or parcel of land
 situated in the County of Douglas and State of Kansas
 described as follows to wit: the fractional north half of
 the north west quarter of Section No. (3) Three in Township No. (4)
 Fourteen Range No. (19) Nineteen and also that part of the South
 west quarter of section No. (34) thirty four in Township (3)
 thirteen of Range No. Nineteen (19) described as follows beginning
