

whole shall become due and payable, and it shall be lawful for said party of the second part his executors, administrators and assigns, at any time thereafter, to sell the premises hereby granted, or any part thereof, in the manner prescribed by law, appraisement hereby waived or not, at the option of the party of the second part, his executors, administrators, or assigns; and out of all the moneys arising from such sale to retain the amount then due for principal and interest, together with the costs and charges of making such sale, and the overplus, if any there be shall be paid by the party making such sale on demand, to the said Robert Sutters his heirs or assigns.
