

Kansas City, in Jackson County, in the State of Missouri, through or adjacent to the cities or towns of Randolph, Birmingham and Liberty in Clay County, Missouri, to the corporate limits of the city of Excelsior Springs in Clay County, Missouri, a distance of thirty (30) miles, forty poles to the mile, equipped with one (1) 10-pin cross arm, carrying three (3) No. 10 B. & S. gauge copper circuits.

(17) A telephone line from the corporate limits of the city of Independence, Jackson County, Missouri, through or adjacent to the cities or towns of Blue Springs, Grain Valley and Oak Grove, in Jackson County, Missouri, and Bates City and Odessa in Lafayette County, Missouri, to the corporate limits of the town of Higginsville, in Lafayette County, Missouri, a distance of forty (40) miles, forty poles to the mile, equipped with one (1) 10-pin cross arm, carrying one (1) No. 10 B. & S. gauge copper circuit.

(18) Also a telephone line from the corporate limits of Carriessville south through or adjacent to the towns of Lane Tree and Archie in Cass County, Missouri; Adrian, Butler, Winbeth, Ethel and Rich Hill, in Bates County, Missouri; Panama, Arthur, Baton, Wales and to the corporate limits of Nevada, in Vernon County, Missouri, a distance of sixty (60) miles, forty poles to the mile, equipped with one (1) 10-pin arm, carrying three (3) No. 10 B. & S. copper circuits.

(19) Also a telephone line from the corporate limits of Ottawa, Franklin County, Kansas, south through or adjacent to the towns of Princeton and Richmond, in Franklin County, Kansas; Seipie, Ismetti, Welda and Colony, in Anderson County, Kansas; Carlyle, Ida, Humboldt, in Allen County, Kansas; Chamato, Earlson, Ward, Thayer and Moshead, in Neosho County, Kansas; Chavergale and to the corporate limits of Independence, in Montgomery County, Kansas, a distance of one hundred and twenty-six (126) miles, forty poles to the mile, equipped with one (1) 10-pin cross arm, carrying four (4) No. 10 B. & S. copper circuits from Ottawa to Ida and three (3) No. 10 B. & S. copper circuits from Ida to Independence.

(20) The long distance toll switch board and equipment of the Telephone Company, located in the building of the Kansas City Home Telephone Company, in the City of Kansas City, in the State of Missouri, having eight (8) operating positions.

(21) An undivided interest in the long distance toll switch board and equipment, situated in the building in which are located the offices of the Topeka Independent.
