Witnesseth that the said parties of the first part, in  
consideration of the sum of Four Thousand Dollars, to  
them duly paid the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged  
have sold, and by these presents do Grant, Bargain, Sell,  
and Mortgage to the said party of the second part his heirs  
and assigns, forever, all that tract or parcel of land situated  
in the County of Douglas, and State of Kansas, described  
as follows, to wit: The North East Quarter of Section eighteen  
(18) Township Fifteen(15) Range Nineteen(19) Containing
