This Indenture, made the first day of July, A.D. 1905, between The Lawrence Home Telephone Company, a corporation duly organized and existing under the laws of the State of Kansas, and having its chief office in the city of Lawrence, in Douglas County, in said state, (hereinafter called The Telephone Company), party of the first part, and The Commonwealth Trust Company, a corporation duly organized and existing under the laws of the State of Missouri, and having its chief office in the city of St. Louis, in said state, (hereinafter called the Trust Company), as Trustee, party of the second part:

Whereas, the Telephone Company is duly incorporated for the purpose of constructing, building, owning, maintaining and operating telephone systems and plants, and is now the owner of a telephone franchise held of regranted by said city of Lawrence, and is now causing to be erected and constructed a telephone plant in said city of Lawrence pursuant to the terms of said franchise, for the purpose of operating the same in said city of Lawrence;

And Whereas, the Telephone Company, for the purpose of providing funds for the payment of its indebtedness, and for the payment of the cost of acquiring and constructing said telephone plant in said city of Lawrence, in said Douglas County, and elsewhere, and for the purpose of providing money for the improvement and extension of its telephone plant and system, has resolved to issue bonds amounting in the aggregate to two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000), framed in accordance with the form hereinafter appearing;

And Whereas, the issue of said bonds and the execution of their presents have been duly consented to, authorized and directed, by the persons holding the larger amount in value of the stock of the Telephone Company, at a meeting of the shareholders thereof duly called and held on the 28th day of June, 1905, for that purpose, and in the manner and form provided by law; And Whereas, at a meeting of the directors of the Telephone
