And Whereas, the sum of four hundred (\$400) dollars was paid to the said Insurance Company on the principal of the said note and mortgage on March 24th 1902, and the interest has been paid to the first day of October 1905, and there remains unpaid on said note and mortgage of the principal thereof, the just and full sum of nine hundred (\$900) dollars, with interest thereon from the first day of October 1905:

And Whereas the said William C. McChintock is now married; his wife's name being Mary McChintock.

And Whereas, the said William C. McChintock and Allison H. McChintock have requested the said Insurance Company to extend the time of payment of the said balance of nine hundred (\$900) dollars remaining unpaid, on the principal of the said note and mortgage until the twenty-seventh day of November A.D. nineteen hundred and ten (1910) with the privilege of paying one hundred (\$100) dollars, or more, of said principal sum on any interest paying day after the twenty-seventh day of November A.D. nineteen hundred and six (1906) and before maturity, and the said Insurance Company has consented and agreed to make such extension as requested.

Now Therefore, in consideration of the premises, and of One Dollar to them in hand paid by The Northwestern Mutual Life Insurance Company, the receipt whereof is hereby confessed and acknowledged, the said William C. McChintock and Allison H. McChintock hereby agree to and with The Northwestern Mutual Life Insurance Company, to pay interest on the said sum of nine hundred (\$900) dollars, being the principal sum remaining unpaid on said note and mortgage from the first day of October A.D. 1905, until paid, at the rate of five (5) per centum per annum,
