

Estate of Emma C. Davenport, deceased, 3730.
 On this the 11th day of March, A. D. 1905, came on to be heard the application of Sallie C. Dallas, for the Probate of a certain Instrument in writing, purporting and alleged to be the last will and testament of Emma C. Davenport, deceased. And said Application and the evidence thereon being heard and it appearing to the Court that due and legal notice of said application has been given and no objection thereto offered; and it further appearing to the Court from the written testimony of De Grand Haskin, one of the subscribing witnesses to said will that said Emma C. Davenport, died in Dallas County, Texas, on the 24th Day of December, 1904, that she executed said Instrument now produced in open court in the presence of said De Grand Haskin and W. B. Watt, witnesses on the 1st day of May 1902, and declared the same to be her last will and testament; that at the time of the execution of said will aforesaid, said testatrix was over the age of 21 years, and of sound mind, and that each of said witnesses were, at the time over the age of 14 years; that said will was never revoked by said testatrix; that said witnesses subscribed said will in the presence of and at the request of said testatrix, and in the presence of each other.

It is considered by the Court that said Instrument be and the same is now here adjudged to be the last will and testament of said Emma C. Davenport, deceased, and that said will and the application for the probate thereof, and all the testimony in the case be recorded in the minutes of this Court. It is further ordered, that Sallie C. Dallas be and she is hereby appointed and confirmed as Independent-Executor of said will, with out Bond, and that the Clerk do issue to her letters testamentary in accordance herewith, upon her taking the oath required by law. It is further ordered by the Court, that S. P. Rively, R. H. Lee, and W. F. Barons, be and they are hereby appointed appraisers to appraise the
