This Indenture, Made the twentieth day of January, in the year of our Lord, One thousand and nine hundred and three, between Elmer E. Sawyer and his wife Nancy L. Sawyer of Douglas in the County of Douglas

and State of Kansas, of the first part, and

Dora J. Sawyer

of the second part:

Witnesseth, That the said parties of the first part, in consideration of the sum of Nine hundred Dollars,

to them duly paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, have sold, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and mortgage to the said party of the second part her heirs and assigns, forever, all that tract or parcel of land situated in the County of Douglas, and State of Kansas, described as follows, to wit: Commencing at the North West corner of the South East Quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Two (2) Township Fourteen Range Eighteen (8) East of the 6th P.M. Meridian running south to intersection with the center line of Lawrence and Monroe, called big road number twenty and twenty one in record kept in the office of the County Clerk and foreid County reestablished by County Commissioners on April 5, 1866, thence Northwesterly until the center line of said road to intersection with North line of said South East Quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of South East Quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of said Section two, thence West to said North line to the place of beginning. And also, the North half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of the South West Quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Number Thirty four (34) in Township Number Thirteen (13) South, of Range Number Eighteen (8) East of the Sixth Principal Meridian, Kansas.

with all the appurtenances, and all the estate, title and interest of the said parties of the first part therein. And the said

parties of the first part do hereby covenant and agree that at the delivery hereof they are the lawful owners of the premises, above granted, and seized of a good and infeeble estate of inheritance therein, free and clear of all incumbrances. Except Mortgage of One thousand dollars Enclosed by the parties of the first part to Fanny Bergman this 24th day of January of 1903 on the last described Eighty acre tract of land. This Grant is intended as a Mortgage to secure the payment of the sum of Nine hundred Dollars

according to the terms of Two certain Notes this day executed and delivered by the said parties of the first part to the said party of the second part One hundred dollars and one note for four hundred dollars and one for four hundred dollars payable on or before conveyance from date and another for four hundred dollars payable on or before conveyance from date. Both bearing interest at the rate of six per cent per annum payable annually. and this conveyance shall be void if such payments be made as herein specified. But if default be made in such payment, or any part thereof, or interest thereon, or the taxes, or if the insurance is not kept up thereon, then this conveyance shall become absolute, and the whole amount shall become due and payable, and it shall be lawful for the said party of the second part, her executors, administrators and assigns, at any time thereafter, to sell the premises hereby granted, or any part thereof, in the manner prescribed by law, and out of all the moneys arising from such sales to retain the amount then due for principal and interest, together with the cost and charges of making such sales, and the overplus, if any there be, shall be paid by the party making such sale, on demand, to said Elmer E. Sawyer his heirs and assigns.
