## III.

## KANSAS CITY 16-INCH LINE.

All that certain gas pipe line, approximately 137 miles in length, being the original gas trunk line, known and designated as Northern Trunk Line No. 1, or Kansas City 16-inch Line, together with all 10-inch, 8-inch and other size branch and gathering lines in Wilson and Montgomery Counties, or elsewhere, belonging to and connected therewith. The Kansas City 16-inch Line begins at a point in Section 15, Township 29, Range 16, in Wilson County, and extends north to a point in the roadway between Sections 10 and 11, Township 28, Range 16; thence continues generally northeasterly through Wilson, Neosho and Allen Counties, to a point in Allen County, in Section 32, Township 26, Range 18, where is located the Petrolia Compressor Station. From this point it extends in a generally northerly direction in Allen County to a point in Section 19, Township 24, Range 18; thence in a generally northeasterly direction, crossing the Neosho River, and continuing through Allen County and into Anderson County, to a point near Garnett, in Section 30, Township 20, Range 20; thence north through Anderson County, to a point in Section 29, Township 19, Range 20, where is located the Scipio Compressor Station; thence continuing north it passes through Anderson County into Franklin County, to a point, east line pressures, thence it extends northeasterly through Franklin County and Douglas County, to a point in Johnson County, Section 3, Township 12, Range 25, where is located the Rosedale Reducing Station, whence it runs east through 45th Street to Hudson Road, where it enters Wyandotte County and extends north on Hudson Road to 39th Street, whence it extends east on 39th Street line extends northerly on Westport Avenue, or a continuation of Hudson Road, to an alley south of Southwest Boulevard, whence it continues east to High or Mill Street; thence generally northwesterly on Mill Street and Fitzgerald Road to the Potomac Heights Reducing Station on Shawnee Road. From Hudson Road and 39th Street a third line extends northerly on Westport Avenue to Division Street, paralleling the second line to College Avenue; thence, from a point on College Avenue near the corner of College Avenue and Westport Avenue, the third line extends northerly to Division Street; thence it extends easterly on Division Street to Mill Street; thence, again paralleling the second line, it extends on Mill Street and Fitzgerald Road to Shawnee Road, whence it extends northeasterly along Shawnee Road to 25th Street and Missouri State Line where is located the 25th Street Reducing Station. Where the line crosses the Neosho River it is provided with fittings and valves, and is sub-divided into three 10-inch steel screened pipe lines, which are imbedded in concrete under the river.

At various points along the line are inserted valves and cross-overs, and the Pipe Line Company is the owner of all valves in the Kansas City 16-inch Line and of an undivided one-half interest in all cross-overs connecting the Kansas City 16-inch Line with any and all other lines.

The Kansas City 16-inch Line is the same line (together with such additions and extensions thereto as have since been made) conveyed by The Kansas Natural Gas, Oil, Pipe Line & Improvement Company to the Pipe Line Company by eight certain deeds (said line being therein designated as "Northern Trunk Line No. 1"), all of which deeds are dated January 31, 1906, and recorded in the offices of the Register of Deeds for the Counties mentioned below on the dates and in the records indicated.

## IV.

## RIGHTS OF WAY, KANSAS CITY 16-INCH LINE

All the Pipe Line Company's right, title, claim and interest in, and to, or by, through or under certain grants of right of way over and across lands and along and across highways in Wilson, Neosho, Allen, Anderson, Franklin, Douglas, Johnson and Wyandotte Counties, Kansas, all to The Kansas Natural Gas, Oil, Pipe Line & Improvement Company. The interest of the Pipe Line Company therein and thereunder is to so much of the right of way granted as is embraced within two lines drawn respectively eighteen inches from and running parallel with the center of the Kansas City 16-inch Line, such interest having been conveyed to the Pipe Line Company by The Kansas Natural Gas, Oil, Pipe Line & Improvement Company by eight certain deeds, all dated January 31, 1906, and recorded in the offices of the Registers of Deeds for the Counties mentioned below on the dates and in the records indicated:
