This Mortgage, made the 20th day of February A.D. 1911 Between William G. Wright an unmarried man of the County of Osage, and State of Kansas, party of the first part, and THE PRUDENTIAL INSURANCE COMPANY OF AMERICA, a body incorporate, existing under and by virtue of the laws of New Jersey, and having its chief office in the City of Newark, and State of New Jersey, party of the second part, Witnesseth: That whereas the said party of the first part is justly indebted to the said THE PRUDENTIAL INSURANCE COMPANY OF AMERICA for money borrowed in the sum of Two Thousand Dollars, to secure the payment of which he has executed his promissory note of even date herewith, payable on the 24th day of February A.D. 1916, being principal note, which note bears interest from Feb. 24th 1911 at the rate of 5½ per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, and evidenced by 10 interest notes of even date therewith, thereto attached.
