This Indenture, Made this Fifteenth day of March in the year of our Lord Nineteen hundred and eighteen, between W.A. Dunn and Elizabeth Dunn, his wife, of the City of Lawrence, in the County of Douglas, and State of Kansas, of the first part, and

Hugh Blair, of the second part:

WITNESSETH, That the said part ies of the first part, in consideration of the sum of Four hundred and fifty DOLLARS,

to them duly paid, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, have sold, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and mortgage to the said part y of the second part his heirs and assigns, forever, all that tract or parcel of land situated in the County of Douglas, and State of Kansas, described as follows, to wit: Commencing at a point in Locust Street in North Lawrence, 20 rods South of and 39 rods and 63 feet East of North west corner of Northwest quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of South west fractional quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of Section 29 in Township 12, of Range 20 East of 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ P.M. thence East 70 feet; thence North 30 degrees; thence East 70 feet; thence South 30 degrees; place of beginning being in city of Lawrence, said County and State.

The mortgagor agrees to keep the buildings on premises insured against fire, lightning and windstorms to the extent of their insurable value, in company or company approved of by this mortgagor with mortgage clause attached making loss payable to said mortgagee or his assigns as interest may appear, and failing to do holder of mortgage may have same insured and the cost of so doing added to the mortgage.

with all the appurtenances, and all the estate, title and interest of the said part ies of the first part therein. And the said parties of the first part do hereby covenant and agree that at the delivery hereof they are the lawful owners of the premises, above granted, and seized of a good and indefeasible estate of inheritance therein, free and clear of all incumbrances.

This Grant is intended as a Mortgage to secure the payment of the sum of

Four hundred & fifty dollars!

according to the terms of one certain note this day executed and delivered by the said parties of the first part to the said part y of the second part payable two years after date with interest thereon at 7% from date until due and 10% after maturity until paid

and this conveyance shall be void if such payments be made as herein specified. But if default be made in such payment, or any part thereof, or interest thereon, or the taxes, or if the insurance is not kept up thereon, then this conveyance shall become absolute, and the whole amount shall become due and payable, and it shall be lawful for the said part y of the second part, his executors, administrators and assigns, at any time thereafter to sell the premises hereby granted, or any part thereof, in the manner prescribed by law; and out of all the moneys arising from such sales to retain the amount then due for principal and interest, together with the cost and charges of making such sales, and the overplus, if any there be, shall be paid by the part y making such sale, on demand, to said parties of the first part their heirs and assigns.
