 Witnesseth, That said part of the first part, in consideration of the sum of  
 - Seven Hundred and 00 DOLLARS,

the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do by these presents, grant, bargain, sell and convey unto said part of the second part, his  
 heirs and assigns, all the following described REAL ESTATE, situated in the County of Douglas and State of Kansas  
 to wit:

An undivided one fourth of the northeast quarter  
 of Section thirteen, Township twelve, Range seventeen  
 lying South of the Lawrence and Topeka Road, consisting  
 of thirty-six and one half acres, and the north forty  
 four acres of the southeast quarter of Section Thirteen  
 Township twelve, Range Seventeen, Douglas County, Kansas.

\$100 on the 1st day of April, 1925.  
 Received of Ben Emery the written amount above,  
 the sum of Seven Hundred Dollars, in full  
 satisfaction of the written Mortgage, L. W. Warner.

To Have and to Hold the Same, Together with all and singular the tenements, hereditaments and appurtenances thereto belonging, or in any wise appertaining, forever:  
 Provided Always, And these presents are upon this express condition, that whereas said Ben Emery and Bessie Emery husband  
 and wife this day executed and delivered their certain promissory note in writing to said part of the second part, of which the following is a  
 copy - #100<sup>2</sup> Topeka, Kansas, May 16th, 1924  
 For Value Received, we promise to pay to L. W. Warner or  
 order, the sum of Seven Hundred and 00 Dollars at Topeka  
 Kansas, in installments payable as follows, to wit:-  
 Twenty five - Dollars on the 15th day of June 1924 and  
 Twenty five - Dollars on the 15th day of each succeeding  
 month thereafter up to and including the 15th day of April  
 1926 and with interest from maturity until paid, at the rate of 6 per  
 cent per annum. In default in payment of any installment when due then all the remaining installments  
 shall become due and payable at once. All signature, endorsements and partial payments  
 hereby acknowledged, protest and notice of non-payment and partial payments  
 before or after maturity, and agree to pay all costs and expenses incurred in collection of this note.

Now, If said part of the first part shall pay or cause to be paid to said part of the second part, his  
 heirs or assigns, said sum of money  
 in the above described note mentioned, together with the interest thereon, according to the terms and tenor of the same, then these presents shall be wholly discharged  
 and void; and otherwise shall remain in full force and effect. But if said sum or sums of money, or any part thereof, or any interest thereon, is not paid when the same is due,  
 and if the taxes and assessments of every nature which are or may be assessed and levied against said premises or any part thereof, or any interest thereon, is not paid when the same are by law made  
 due and payable; then the whole of said sum and sums and interest thereon, shall, and by these presents, become due and payable and said part of the second part  
 shall be entitled to the possession of said premises.
