

75. The undivided one-third of the entire leasehold estate created by lease dated May 25, 1920 from said Charles Brown, Principal Chief, as aforesaid to the Company et al, demising the southeast quarter of Sec. 26, Twp 22 N., R. 11 E. in Osage County, Oklahoma.

76. The undivided one-half of the entire leasehold estate created by lease dated May 18, 1916 from John A. Hack to the Southwestern Petroleum Co., et al, demising the southwest quarter of Sec. 32, Twp 25 N., R. 1 W., in Kay County Oklahoma.

77. The entire lease hold estate created by lease dated May 13, 1916, from John F. Marker to the Tulame Oil Co. and by them later assigned to the Company, demising lots 3 and 4 and the south one-half of the northwest quarter all in Sec. 4, Twp. 23 N., R. 1 W. in Noble County, Oklahoma.

78. The entire lease hold estate created by lease dated May 18, 1920 from D. G. Reynolds, guardian, to the Company demising the northwest fourth of the northeast quarter and the northeast fourth of the northwest quarter of Sec. 10 (excepting 1 72/100 acres for railway right-of-way) in Twp. 5 S., R. 5 W. in Jefferson County, Oklahoma.

79. The entire lease hold estate created by lease dated October 27, 1920 from J. C. Parks to the Company demising the north one-half of the southwest quarter of Sec. 22 Twp. 22 N., R. 7 E. in Pawnee County, Oklahoma.

80. The entire lease hold estates created by 2 leases dated October 12, 1920 from the Chief of the Osage Tribe of Indians to the Company, one demising the southwest quarter of Sec. 3, Twp 22 N., R. 10 E. and the other demising the northeast quarter of Sec. 29, Twp. 29 N. R. 11 E. all in Osage County, Oklahoma.

81. The undivided one-third of the entire lease hold estates created by 3 leases all dated October 12, 1920 from the Chief of the ^{Prize} ~~Tribe of Indians to the Company and~~ to the Skelly Oil Co. and the Phillips Petroleum Co. one demising the northeast quarter of Sec. 27, Twp. 29 N., the second demising the southwest quarter of Sec. 12, Twp. 21 N. and the third demising the northeast quarter of Sec. 34, Twp. 29 N. all in R. 11 E., in Osage County, Oklahoma;

82. The entire lease hold estate created by lease dated November 12, 1918 from J. F. Wagner to E. G. Knight, demising 5 acres of land known and described as Tract # 2 of the E. G. Knight sub-division of the north one-half of Block #72 of the Red River Valley Lands, in Wichita County, Texas.

83. The entire lease hold estate created by lease dated June 10, 1918, from Edmund R. Statham to M. M. Waite, demising the south half of the southeast quarter of Sec. 36, Twp. 26 N., R. 12 E. in Washington County, Oklahoma.

84. The entire lease hold estate created by lease dated January 17, 1918, from H. J. Holm, Guardian of Emmett Longbone, to W. H. Byron, demising the south half of the northeast fourth of the southwest quarter and the north half of the southeast fourth of the southwest quarter of Sec. 17, Twp. 26 N., R. 13 E., in Washington County, Oklahoma.

85. The entire lease hold estate created by lease recorded January 24, 1918, in Book B76, Page 53, from W. H. Webber to Getty Oil Company, demising the east half of the southwest quarter of Sec 14, Twp 12 N. R. 8 E., in Oklahoma County, Oklahoma.

Gunn Plant site.

The entire leasehold estate created by lease dated February 27, 1918 from William Gunn, a widower, to the Company, demising the surface rights only in a tract of land described as follows:

Commencing at an iron pin in the south line of the Northwest quarter of Sec. 19, Twp. 25 N., R. 1 E. in Kay County, Oklahoma, distant 1,765 feet east of the southwest corner of said Northwest quarter of Sec. 19; running thence south 400 feet to an iron pin; thence east 369 feet to a point on the west low water mark line of the Chikaskia River; ^{thence, and 133 ft. to the point on the east bank of the Chikaskia River} thence along the east low water mark line of said River in a northeasterly direction to a point 759 feet due east of the place of beginning; thence west 759 feet to the place of beginning, containing, including the River, 5.881 acres.

Also a strip of land 33 feet wide, beginning at the West side of the above described tract and running along and adjoining the north line of the southwest quarter of said Sec. 19, east to the Meridian Line.

Gunn Water Line.

A four inch water pipe line used for transporting water from the Chikaskia River at the Gunn Plant Site to the Billings Field, the route, line and direction of said water pipe line being more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point 35 feet south of and 2210 feet east of the west quarter corner of section 19, Township 25 north, range 1 east, in Kay County, Oklahoma, thence in a westerly direction 2200 feet through the above mentioned section thence in a southwesterly direction through sections 24, 25, 26, and 35, Township 25 north, range 1 west, thence continuing in a southwesterly direction through sections 2, 10, 9, and 16, township 24 north, range 1 west, thence in a southerly direction through sections 16 and 21, township 24 north, range 1 west, thence in a southwesterly direction through sections 20 and 30, township 24 north, range 1 west thence in a southerly direction to the center of section 31, township 24 north, range 1 west, thence in a southwesterly direction through section 31, township 24 north, range 1 west, thence continuing in a southwesterly direction through sections 1, 2, 11 and to the center of section 10, township 23 north, range 2 west,
