

some newspaper published, in said Kansas City notifying the holders of said bonds to present the same for payment at a time and place to be therein specified and that after the expiration of such time said bonds shall cease to draw interest.

Article X. It is also further understood and agreed that the holders of any of the bonds to be issued, hereunder may on the 15th day of October 1885 or on the 15th day of October 1886 if they so elect exchange the same for an equal amount of the capital stock of the party of the first part at par.

Article XI. The said party of the second part hereby accepts the trust herein created.
