

Indenture, page 66, said water line totals 0.39 miles of 10" pipe in Cowley County, Kansas.

A 2" water line extending from the Dilworth Compressor Station in the Dilworth Station to Wichita System as described in the Original Indenture, page 64, total 1.63 miles of 2" pipe in Kay County, Oklahoma.

Telephone Lines.

All those telephone lines, together with the easements for constructing, maintaining, replacing and operating the same, including all structures, poles, wires, tools and appliances and other personal property used in connection therewith located in the States of Kansas and Oklahoma, generally described as follows:

(a) A telephone pole line and wires extending in a southerly direction from Douglas in Butler County, Kansas to Cimarron Pump Station in Logan County, Oklahoma, and passing through the counties of Butler and Cowley in Kansas, and Kay, Noble, Garfield, Payne, and Logan in Oklahoma, with branch lines to Winfield in Sec. 28, T. 32S., R. 4E., and to Arkansas City Pump Station in Sec. 25, T. 34S., R. 3E., and to Arkansas City Gasolene Plant in Sec. 13, T. 34S., R. 3E., all in Cowley County, Kansas; and to Dilworth Compressor Station in Sec. 31, T. 29N., R. 1E., Kay County, Oklahoma; also a branch line on foreign poles to the Blackwell Compressor Station in Kay County, Oklahoma; also a branch pole line and wires to the Ponca City Refinery and Pump Station in Sec. 34, T. 26N., R. 2E., Kay County, Oklahoma; also a branch pole line and wires extending westward to the Hotson Lease in Sec. 25, T. 24N., R. 4W., Garfield County, Oklahoma; also a branch pole line and wires to the Black Bear Tank Farm in Sec. 33, T. 22N., R. 1E., Noble County, Oklahoma; also a branch line on foreign poles to Perry in Sec. 14, T. 21N., R. 1W., Noble County, Oklahoma; also a branch line extending east to Bartlesville in Washington County, Oklahoma with lateral
