T. 10N., R. 6E., Seminole County, Oklahoma and extending easterly to Okmulgee and thence northerly to Tulsa, and passing through the counties of Seminole, Okfuskce, Okmulgee, Creek and Tulsa in Oklahoma, and aggregating 1013¢ miles of wires on foreign poles; also 2¾ miles of pole line and wire extending to the Kingwood field in Okfuskce County, Oklahoma; also 1 mile of pole line and wire extening to Okmulgee Refinery and Pump Station in Okmulgee County, Oklahoma.

(f) A telephone line extending in a southerly direction from the Cimarron Pump Station to the Oklahoma City field system, as described above, beginning at the Empire Pipeline Company office in Sec. 3, T. 11N, R. SW., Oklahoma County, Oklahoma, and running in a westerly direction, O.05 miles with two No. 8 B. & S. copper wires on Company poles, thence 0.17 miles with two No. 8 B. & S. copper wires on M. K. T. R. R. and Western Union Telegraph Company poles, thence 0.17 miles with two No. 14 drop wires on M. K. T. R. R. and Western Union Telegraph Company poles, thence in a southerly direction 0.25 miles in Western Union Telegraph Company cable, thence 2.71 miles with two No. 8 B. & S. copper wires on A. T. & S. F. R. R. and Western Union Telegraph Company poles, thence phone Company cable to the Cities Serrice Oil Company office in Sec. 22, T. 11N., R. 3W., Oklahoma County, Oklahoma.

(g) A telephone pole line and wires extending northwesterly from Sec. 36, T. 28S., R. 3E., Battler County, Kansas, from a point on the telephone line system (d), as described in the Original Indenture, page 122, to a point of connection with the present system (d) in Sec. 18, T. 28S., R. 2E., Sedgwick County, Kansas; also a telephone pole line extending north from the above described line to a point of connection with the present system (d) as described in the Original Indenture, page 122, in Sec. 33, T. 27S., R. 2E., Sedgwick County, Kansas. Above described telephone system comprises approximately 6½ miles of pole line and wires in Butter County.
