

Telephone Line Permits.

All permits from County Commissioners, State Highway Commissions and Railroad Companies in the several states, authorizing and permitting the constructing, maintaining and operating of telephone lines over, across and upon public roads, highways, bridges, ways and right-of-ways, including:

TELEPHONE LINE PERMITS FROM COUNTY COMMISSIONERS.

Butler County, Kansas.

Permit to use and occupy certain parts of the public road for a telephone and telegraph line to-wit: Commencing at a point on the public highway located approximately at the SW Corner of Sec. 17, T. 28S., R. 3E.; thence due east on said public highway approximately four miles to the SW Corner of Sec. 13 thence due South on said public highway approximately two and one half miles, to a point where it would meet the present line of the Company.

Sedgwick County, Kansas.

Permit to use and occupy certain parts of the public road for a telephone and telegraph line to-wit: Commencing at a point in the public highway at or near the SE corner Sec. 13, T. 28S., R. 2E.; thence due West on said public highway approximately five miles to a point at or near the SW corner Sec. 17, T. 28S., R. 2E., where it would meet the present line of the Company; also commencing at a point in the public highway at or near the SW corner Sec. 15, T. 28S., R. 2E.; thence North on said public highway two miles; thence West one mile; thence North one mile to a point North of and near the SW corner of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 33, T. 27S., R. 2E., where it would meet the present line of the Company.
