Witnesseth That said parties of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of One Thousand and no/100 (\$1,000.00) Dollars to Myrtle Wilson hand paid by the said party of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold, and conveyed, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and convey unto the said party of the second part and to its successors and assigns forever, all of the following described tract, piece, and parcel of land lying and situated in the County of Douglas and State of Kansas, to-wit:

East Half (E½) of Lot No. One Hundred (100), all of Lot No. One Hundred One (101) and West Half (W½) of Lot No. One Hundred Two (102), in Addition No. Two (2) in that part of the City of Lawrence known as North Lawrence

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the same, with all and singular the hereditaments and appurtenances thereto belonging, unto the said party of the second part, and to its successors and assigns forever; PROVIDED ALWAYS, and this instrument is made, executed, and delivered upon the following conditions, to-wit:

Whereas, the said Myrtle Wilson has this day executed and delivered her certain promissory note in writing to the party of the second part, payable at its office in the City of Kansas City, State of Missouri as follows, to-wit: \$15.00 on April 10, 1952, and \$15.00 on the 10th day of each month thereafter until a total of sixty-six such monthly installments shall have been paid, followed by final payment of principal in the amount of \$10.00 on October 10, 1957;

with interest on the unpaid principal from March 10, 1952 at the rate of three percent per annum, payable monthly, beginning April 10, 1952.
